
Farmers Cooperative and their feed supplier, Southern States are proud to offer the Southern States Club Master Awards Program.



A Kauffman Family Recipe Smothered Pork Chops

6 pork chops 2 cans of cream of mushroom soup paprika course ground black pepper salt to taste rice to serve with chops

In a large cast iron skillet, add two tablespoons of oil. Place meat in skillet and season with paprika, salt, and pepper. Brown pork chops in oil until brown on both sides. Move pork chops to the side and add 2 cans of soup. Whisk together to mix. Re-arrange chops in pan and smother with soup mixture. Cook until pork chops are tender and done.

Hay Ring Saves \$\$

Hay feeding practices can greatly influence the amount of hay that is required to carry a herd throughout the winter. Feeding bales in the roll remains the most common practice.

ONCE THE cattle are full, activity around the bale including trampling, defecation, urination and lying in the hay will result in hay losses. Studies have shown that when feeding unprotected round rolls, about 40% of your hay is wasted. Protecting hay from animal activity can help reduce your losses.

The most common way to protect your rolls from excessive waste is with a hay ring feeder.

Hay Feeding Methods compared:

- 1. Unprotected 60 rolls @ \$35.00 per roll = \$2,100.00 / 40% loss = \$840.00
- 2. Protected 60 rolls @ \$35.00 per roll = \$2,100.00 / 6% loss = \$126.00

Sales Volume Tops \$10 Million

Farmers Cooperative's 63nd Annual Membership Meeting was held at Live Oak Church of God in Live Oak on October 3, 2009. Following registration, the meeting started at 10:00 a.m. Several door prizes were awarded to the 133 members attending the Annual Membership Meeting.

GENERAL Manager Lawrence reported annual sales volume of \$10,003,151 for Fiscal Year 2008-2009 and a net profit of \$102,487 to be paid as follows: 49% in cash, \$50,218 and 51% notified equity, \$52,269. Additionally, Farmers Cooperative, Inc. paid \$51,064 to deceased members spouses

or heirs.

Fertilizer volume, \$3,083,844, Refund, \$23,514, or .76%; Feed and Animal Health volume, \$1,719,585, Refund \$14,787 or .86%; Crops volume \$382,930, Refund, \$5,699 or 1.48%; Ag Chemical volume, \$574,136, Refund, \$6,857 or 1.19%; Farm Supplies volume, \$1,428,522, Refund \$13,969 or .98% and LP Gas volume \$2,814,134, Refund \$37,661 or 1.14% or 3.47 cents per gallon.

PATRONAGE Refund for 2008-2009 checks were mailed in December, and should also be included in your 2009 tax return.
